Sacraments of Confirmation & First Holy Communion

Teaching & Learning

At present we are in the process of administering standardised spelling, reading and maths tests. Test results will be analysed by the Special Education Needs (S.E.N.) team in conjunction with class teachers and myself in order to inform Curriculum Planning and our School Improvement Plan 2025-2026.

School Reports will be issued on June 12th via Aladdin Connect. If you require a hard copy of the report please contact the school office. Education Passports/Irish Exemptions (6th class) will be forwarded to relevant secondary schools.

School Self Evaluation

As part of School Self Evaluation we have focussed on Spellings(2nd-6th), Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Programme (Jun Infants-1st class) and Musical Literacy (all classes). Children's test results and work samples will be analysed to evaluate their progress and this in turn will determine our School Improvement Plan targets for 25/26. In reponse to the Whole School Evaluation recommendations we have also upgraded our main library and class libraries snd we have extended the time allocated to teaching of writing genres throughout the school. We are constantly striving to improve best practice in order to enhance educational provision in the school.

SEN: Special Educational Needs

The SEN team are working with class teachers and pupils to support literacy and numeracy throughout the school through a number of initiatives. Literacy Lift Off has commenced in Senior Infants (Ms Shine's class) and will run for the next 6 weeks. Parents need to support their child by reading the familiar book they have in their folder every night. The Reading Recovery Programme is also offered to children with emergent literacy needs. Mrs. McCabe is our Reading Recovery Teacher. The SEN Team also respond to and support children with social, emotional and behavioural needs with transient to long term interventions. We appreciate the ongoing support of parents which adds to the success of all these initiatives.

Children who receive a diagnosis during the school year are monitored and placed on the Continuum of support at a level which best meets their needs - be that Classroom Support, School Support or School Support Plus.

Summer Programme 2025

Once again we are offering a school based Summer Provision Programme commencing June $26^{th}-9^{th}$ July for students with complex and special educational needs and those at risk of educational disadvantage. Mr \bar{O} ' $h\bar{O}$ gain has been appointed as Organiser. A letter pertaining to this programme has been sent to eligible students. It is important that parents who have received this letter respond whether their children are available to take part or not as places in the programme are limited. The theme of the programme continues to be "Building Confidence and Connections" and will build upon the children's work with their school support teachers during the school year.

ICT



There was great news for Cloonakilla NS last term when we were announced as recipients of a €1000 grant from RISE in partnership with National Broadband Ireland. This gave us an opportunity to invest in new technology. We purchased two tablets to provide audio books and a C Pen to enable those with reading difficulties to access text easily.

The RISE Community Fund, established by NBI Chairman David McCourt, has already supported over 140 rural organisations nationwide,

empowering communities with the tools they need to thrive in the digital age. We had a very exciting morning on March 25th before heading off to sing at our school's Confirmation. 5th class and members of our Tech Team met with David McCourt and his team for photos and videos for the press release.

Classes have been participating in online zoom calls run in conjunction with Education Centres in Ireland & committees within our school. Pupils took part in a fantastic Easter Maths Quiz which promoted lots of maths talk & cognitively challenging learning experiences. These workshops provide an opportunity to communicate with other schools in a safe forum and within the safety of our classrooms. Well done to the current Coiste Gaelbhratach who hosted events through the platform of Zoom throughout the whole school. They were most impressive hosts and navigated their way through the use of multiple technologies with ease.
